

A Message from Commander Kutz


Greetings Ward 1 Residents,

On behalf of the Fourth District Cleveland Division of Police, I hope that everyone is having a safe, warm, and happy New Year so far. As we close the first month in this new, promising year, we are reminded of the great strides and steps we all have taken together to provide a more safe and comfortable neighborhood. The Cleveland Division of Police continues to strive towards reducing

illegal activity by providing a significant increase in enforcement and patrols for the safety and concerns of those who reside in Ward 1, the Fourth District, and throughout the City of Cleveland. We are also focused on addressing violent crime. The creation of a Violent Crime Reduction Team, a coalition of City-wide resources and other law enforcement agencies, has led to significant gun recoveries. arrests and crime interdiction. Additionally, we are testing gun-shot detection technology in a portion of the Fourth District. The technology has given us the ability to respond quickly and accurately to gunfire incidents, leading to arrests, gun recoveries and being able to bring critical first-aid to shooting victims.

We continue to need the support of our community to address issues and concerns that arise in our neighborhoods. The best results we see in addressing public safety are when the community, our officers and our stakeholders work together to find solutions that are effective and meaningful. Please consider joining or forming a street or block club. Meet with your neighbors, discuss your concerns and invite us to attend! We can work with you to make your street the best it can be.

Does Your Home

Have Smoke

24-hour hotline at 216-361-5535 to apply for FREE smoke alarms

Operation Save-A-Life, a program of the American Red Cross and the Cleveland Fire Department, provides FREE smoke alarms and batteries to Cleveland residents. Smoke alarms are installed by Cleveland firefighters at no cost to residents. Please note that application and installation process may take up to 90 days. Smoke alarms provide an early warning of fire and can increase the chances of a safe escape. According to the **Cleveland Fire Department, nearly 75% of** deaths in house fires are caused by smoke rather than burns. Children and senior citizens are at greatest risk

If you already have smoke alarms, then regular maintenance is important. It is suggested that smoke alarms be replaced every 10 years. They should also be tested each month and batteries should be changed twice each year, whether the smoke detector needs new ones or not.
