#### Happy Spring Residents,

As many of you know I traveled to New York City last month to visit the headquarters of the company that owns several Shaker Boulevard apartment buildings. I went to demand they fix and improve their buildings that have been allowed to deteriorate with leaks, no heat and water, electrical problems, including elevator issues.

I went to the Chetrit Group Headquarters on New York's Madison Avenue on Feb. 10 without an appointment, and even paid a visit to one of the uptown New York mansion of one of the owners in the search for answers.

"We're sick and tired of them not having heat, water; electrical problems, just deplorable conditions," I said from in front of corporate headquarters. "We're here in New York, and I'm going to address the situation. I will show these pictures to the brothers that own the buildings on Shaker Boulevard."

Gray said she was finally able to meet with one of the building co-owners, and I told him we were sick and tired of residents not having

heat, water, just deplorable conditions. He promised, and several owners showed up to a meeting in Cleveland on Feb. 22 to discuss the issues and find out their plan for fixes. Many of you showed up to express your frustration and desire for real accountability and repairs.

I continue to work with and get updates on Shaker Square issues and the plan for improvements and new businesses. I will keep you all up to date on these issues, as well as Buckeye Road developments.

I look forward to seeing you in the neighborhoods and at my meetings. Don't forget to check out the spring programs, classes and other events at the recreation centers, Woodhill, Zelma George and Alexander Hamilton.



WOODHILL STATION WEST (PHASE 1) 2021-2023



The Woodhill Station West located at the intersection of Buckeye and Woodhill roads is well underway, converting an empty lot into 120 new apartments to the neighborhood. They will run from one bedroom to three bedrooms and some will be reserved for current Woodhill Homes residents. But there will be thirty available for new residents at an affordable price. The location right across from the RTA station makes these apartments a prime location. The building will also feature an outdoor picnic area, playground, community room, fitness center, and nice landscaping.

While the collaboration between Fifth Third

and Enterprise Community Partners to target for redevelopment the area south of Buckeye Road, to help residents purchase and rehabilitate single-family homes and Cleveland Doubles (two-story two-family homes), hasn't fully begun. Some progress is underway with Burten, Bell, Carr Development starting the rehabilitation of three vacant houses in the neighborhood. The funding for the home rehabs is through the Fifth Third grants that are coming to the neighborhood. Feel free to contact Burten, Bell, Carr for more information or program questions at 216-




