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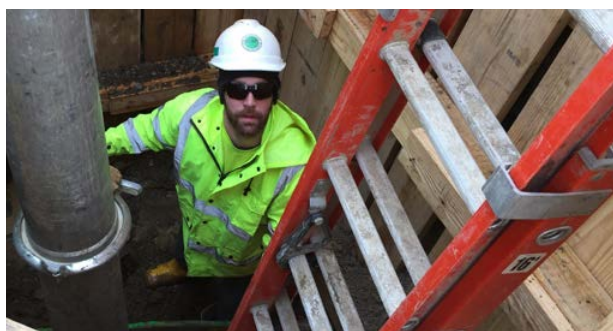

\$4.7 Million Sewer Project Will Bring Flood Relief to Ward 11

The \$4.7 million Bellaire Road Area Sewer Project – set to begin this spring – will alleviate street and basement flooding in homes and businesses in Ward 11 after heavy rainfall and wastewater backups, at no cost to property owners. "When it is all said and done, this will improve the quality of life in Ward 11. We are fortunate to have flooding relief solutions and great partners to assist us with projects that benefit our ward and the entire community," said Councilman Danny Kelly.

The relief sewer project consists of installing a relief main sewer and replacing existing sewers in the area including Bellaire Road and Leeila Avenue. Workers from the Division of Water Pollution Control, Department of Public Utilities (WPC) will be on the jobsite, improving the sewer lines and storm drains in Ward 11.

The project will take place within the following approximate boundaries:



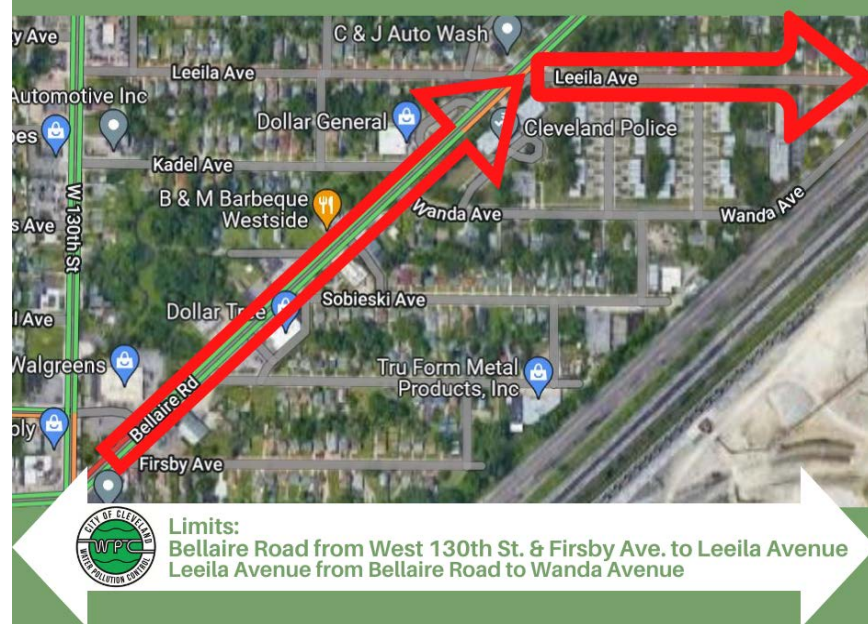
Bellaire Road to the west, **Brookfield Avenue** to the north, railroad tracks to the east, and **Firsby Avenue** to the south. Work will occur at Bellaire Road from West 130 Street & Firsby Avenue to Leeila Avenue and Leeila Avenue from Bellaire Road to Wanda Avenue.

The existing circa 1930's sewer system is inadequate, causing street and property flooding. A public main sewer failure can lead to the following:

- Backups into private properties; including but not limited to basement flooding causes
- Personal damages and health concerns
- Street flooding due to failed main sewer
- Street collapse; ground undermining/ sinkholes
- Illicit discharge resulting in health and environmental concerns

We do not want any of that in Ward 11! When done properly, wastewater and storm water management keeps the sewer system

flowing and water system ongoing. This means clean water for ward 11 residents and businesses.

Councilman Danny Kelly in anticipation of the project breaking ground stated, "We are excited to start construction of this vital flood relief project! As a 45-year member of Laborers Local 310, I have worked on many jobsites and I know it is a hard day of work. I want to, ahead of time, thank the WPC, City of Cleveland, workers for their contribution to our neighborhood and the residents and businesses for their patience as construction takes place in the ward. We will continue to work closely with everyone involved to deliver successfully this project to Ward 11."

Halloran Ice Rink \$2 Million Roof Renovation is Underway

Construction on a \$2 million rebuild of the Halloran Ice Rink roof is underway. A new, more modern roof this spring at Halloran will be a culmination of the upgrades to this iconic hot spot for fun and fitness in Ward 11. Although it is “out with the old and in with the new”, this facility has a storied history.

Ensign William Halloran, a neighborhood resident and journalist, killed in the attack on Pearl Harbor, is the namesake of historic Halloran Park. The ice rink first opened on Christmas Eve in 1959. Since then, families and children looking for fun and entertainment have spent time at Halloran Ice Rink.

In the 1970’s, a roof was added. The roof makes the rink unique. The Halloran Rink is a hybrid rink, meaning it is outdoors and has no walls, but it has a roof to protect it from rain and snow. It also happens to be the only public rink in the city of Cleveland and people can skate there free, or rent skates for \$1 if need be.

Five decades is a long time. The existing roof leaks water onto the ice, causing mounds of ice to build up and chipped away by hand. The new \$2 million roof will top off \$1.5 million in renovations, coupled with \$30,000 in upgrades.

Already, Halloran Ice Rink has opened with the ice professionally done, striped,



and including installed players’ boxes, penalty boxes, and scorekeeper boxes. In addition to the roof improvements, the rink’s refrigeration system replacement includes but is not limited to a new chiller, floor, piping and installing new dashboards, a new sub-floor heating system to prevent permafrost heaving and a new rink floor utilizing polyethylene (PEX) tubing and a glycol piping system. Now, that is an investment in making Ward 11’s ice rink sparkle!

That is not all. Halloran Rink offers roller-skating in the summer, in addition to use of the ice rink and warming house in the winter. It is hybrid, city run and year round. There is also a variety of activities for residents to engage in at the rink. Councilman Danny Kelly said, “The new roof will make the rink more accessible to the public and safeguard the upgrades too. Lace up your skates Ward 11; I will see you on the rink!”

Councilman Kelly supports Affordable Transportation for Seniors

Ward 11 seniors can meet their transportation needs through the Senior Transportation Connection (STC). **The program serves people 60 years of age or older who have limited options for transportation.** STC provides two, one-way trips per week to eligible riders.

- **First-time riders** must call the Cleveland Department of Aging at 216-664-2833, once enrolled, call 216-265-1489.
- **Registered riders** must call 216-265-1489 to schedule a ride.

- Call Center hours of operation: 7:00 am - 5:00 pm, Monday through Friday.
- **When scheduling elderly transportation services, be sure to ask to verify your fare.** Fares are set by your community or nonprofit provider. Senior Transportation Connection **does not** set the amount you are charged for senior rides.

DIVISION OF WASTE COLLECTION

Set Out Guidelines

- ▶ Please contain all waste in the carts provided by the city:**
- Use black/gray city issued cart for household trash and bagged yard waste.
 - NO trash should be placed outside of the black/gray cart.
- ▶ Place carts out no earlier than noon the day before your regular pick up day.** Remove carts by noon the following day.

WEEKLY WASTE

- ▶ You may set out a limit of 3 bulk items.**
- Such as tables and chairs, mattresses and box springs, couches, furniture.
 - All mattresses, box springs, leather and cloth furniture must be wrapped in plastic.
 - The city does not accept construction material.
 - Boxes and bags are not bulk items.
- ▶ You may set out up to 4 tires (passenger tires only). Tires must be off the rim.** Please call 216-664-3711 to schedule a 4 tire pick up.

BULK DISPOSAL

- ▶ Branches must be cut and bundled.** (Each bundle cannot exceed 3 ft. in length and 2 ft. in diameter.)
- All leaves and grass clippings must be contained, up to 20 bags per week.
