The fall also ushers in the election season. Nov. 7th is an important election day for a number of reasons. Please plan ahead, whether you plan on voting by mail, in person early or on election day. (See info on voting inside.)

One of the issues on the ballot is Issue 38. I am asking residents to vote against Issue 38 which would give \$14 million to an unelected group of people to decide upon yet to be determined projects in the city.

The \$14 million diverted from the General Fund could lead to massive layoffs and have a devastating impact on the city.

The \$14 million requested for participatory budgeting is more than the city currently pays for many critical services, including Aging, Public Health and the Building and Housing Department. Additionally, the proposed amount is greater than the \$12 million currently allocated for repaving and repairing streets in the entire city.

This proposal - which every council person is against - will have devastating impacts on our public safety and city services.



- 1. Submit a ballot application to vote from home. You can print or request a ballot application online at www.443vote.us or by calling 216-443-VOTE (8683).
- 2. We will mail your ballot to you with a return envelope.
- 3. Vote and return your signed ballot envelope before Election Day.
- 4. Use the Track Your Vote-by-Mail Ballot tool on our website to track your ballot throughout the process!

A safer, more connected community is only a few steps away.

Participating in the Safe Smart CLE, Camera Registration or Integration Programs enables law enforcement to easily locate the nearest camera in a designated area during the course of an investigation.



How does the Safe Smart CLE, Camera Registry Work?

The Safe Smart CLE Camera Registration Program is a partnership directly with the Cleveland Department of Public Safety. The camera registry gives private residents and businesses the ability to register their cameras to an on-line portal, only accessible through permission, for the Department of Public Safety personnel to quickly and easily use cameras to create a map of relevant cameras to obtain evidence for crimes and incidents. Registering cameras will not allow remote access to cameras.

What is the Safe Smart CLE, Camera Integration Program?

The Safe Smart CLE Camera Integration Program is a partnership directly with the Cleveland Department of Public Safety. The program enables businesses to share live video feeds with public safety personnel in emergencies to improve community safety and situational awareness for the Cleveland Department of Public Safety.

A fūsusCORE will be provided to businesses, to create a virtual bridge between the business and the Cleveland Department of Public Safety. There will be no impact to the business network.


