2020 has been a challenging year, but I am proud of how we have banded together to help our fellow neighbors and offer many community-facing programs in a different way than we have before. Events like our Halloween Drive-in and Voter Registration drive have been huge success for the Ward. Two different census-outreach projects offered by Famicos Foundation and Greater Collinwood Development Corporation helped ensure a complete count of our citizens. But it is you, the resident, who I cannot thank enough for ensuring these programs continue during a much different season.

At the Northern Ohio Recovery Association (NORA) center, thousands of people received free pantry items, toiletries, and produce over the year. Rest assured, residents can still come by on the third Monday of the month for pantry items and the third Friday for fresh produce. Meanwhile, residents in the senior program at Five Pointe Community Center continue to receive pre-packaged meals several times a week. All returns are completed by IRS-certified volunteer tax preparers at tax sites located across Cuyahoga County. When you schedule an appointment, you can easily find the tax sites closest to you. New this year, virtual appointments are also available. We've gone to great lengths to make sure you can get your taxes done while also staying safe.

This service is available for those who qualify and make under \$57,000 a year.






Phase 1 of Graffiti Heart Mural Installation at Euclid-Green

GCDC, Famicos Foundation and Councilman Anthony Hairston partnered to bring Graffiti HeArt to Euclid-Green for a mural installation that celebrates the history and community of the Cleveland Ward 10 neighborhood. The mural, extending over 100 feet long and 12 feet at its highest, is located just east of Ivanhoe/ Belvoir on Euclid Avenue and can be seen at its fullest on the north side of the street.

The Euclid-Green mural was installed August 8th - August 9th. Euclid-Green residents were encouraged to show their support by honking their horns or participating in the community portion of the wall. The mural, celebrating the history and future of Euclid-Green, includes images of a Collinwood High School football helmet, Duggan Park water park, Chandler Cars, King Cole's Pizza, Black Lives Matter and an homage and quote from the late Congressman John R. Lewis.

Waste Collection Set Out Guidelines

FOR WEEKLY TRASH & RECYCLING



- Please place all waste in the carts provided by the city. Place carts out no earlier than noon the day before your regular pick up day. Remove carts by noon the following day. If possible, use off street parking on your collection day.
- Use blue cart for ALL recyclables (glass, metal, plastic, paper and cardboard). Place items in cart unbagged. NO recyclables should be placed outside of the blue cart.
- Use black/gray city issued cart for household trash and yard waste. NO trash should be placed outside of the black/gray cart.

COVID-19 Assistance Information

UTILITY & RENTAL ASSISTANCE - Programs to help eligible residents in need of assistance paying sewer, water, wastewater, electric, and gas utilities are expected to start again in early 2021. **Make sure you check with CHN Housing Partners** (www.chnhousingpartners.org) and Council for Economic Opportunities (www.ceogc.org)after the passage of Congress' new bill to help citizens.

Funds are still additional through the Council for Economic Opportunities in Greater Cleveland (CEOGC) to Cuyahoga County residents who are at or below 200% of the Federal Poverty Level for utility assistance until the end of the year. If you don't make

it, check in the new year. Remember, if you are facing problems related to housing Legal Aid Society of Cleveland can help. Legal Aid represents individuals and groups to:
