A Word from Councilman Joe Jones

Dear Ward 1 residents,

An ancient Ethiopian proverb says, "When spiders unite, they can tie down a lion."

Indeed, unity is the key to accomplish any task; to conquer any goal; to prevail over any adversity. Therefore, our primary goal here in Ward 1 is to unite ourselves as a people; as a voice; as a movement aimed at creating and sustaining a healthy, secure, safe and vibrant community.

Since I became your councilman over 15 months ago, I have been working to ensure our ward receives basic city services and I have been building bridges between various sectors – religious, business, safety forces, community leaders and private citizens – to create a strong community, much like the community of those spiders in Ethiopia. Strong enough to hold down a lion.

Our lion, of course, is the street crime and violence we see too often in Ward 1. I have been working with residents to form **block watches** and to report any suspicious activities. If you see something, say something. As residents of Ward 1, we must all take ownership of our neighborhoods and not tolerate any action that would threaten our quality of life.

I have been working with the city on a massive project to brighten **street lighting and installing security cameras in various public places.** The project has already begun in Ward 1, replacing street lights with high-tech LED lights that provide more illumination than existing conventional lights. The project is also installing security cameras in hot-spot crime areas. Criminals might run, but they can't hide.

In other developments, a new primary health care clinic opened recently in the Lee Harvard Plaza. **Oak Street Health Center** focuses on serving Medicare patients in medically underserved neighborhoods.

Besides medical, the clinic is offering various social

services for seniors.

And on the subject of seniors, I have been working on a proposal to build a **housing complex for seniors.** We're not ready to break ground yet, but the pieces are coming together. Stay tuned.

Also, plans are moving ahead on the building of a new John F. Kennedy High School, along with a new city recreation center, near Miles and Lee roads.

Finally, the good weather is still here and it's a good time for fixing up and cleaning up. The city's **grass cutting program for seniors** is back in business as are **free paint and home repair programs. Major road repair projects** are underway, including the repaving of East 131st Street. I am also excited about the Harvard Avenue street resurfacing project being completed as it improves the conditions of our community

So, we're seeing solid progress in Ward 1 and it's important that we keep up the momentum. Meanwhile, enjoy what is left of this good weather, help a neighbor and keep an eye on the neighborhood.


Councilman Joe Jones' **Ministerial Prayer Breakfast**

Councilman Jones Works to Light up Neighborhoods

Ward 1 Selected as one of the first communities to receive LED street lights



Councilman Jones at the July 1 launch of the City of Cleveland's streetlight conversion program, a project that combines cost-saving and energy-efficient LED streetlights with smart camera technology.

Councilman Joe Jones has been working with Mayor Frank Jackson's administration on a massive project

to **brighten street** lighting throughout the city and install security cameras in various public places.

The city council approved legislation to replace all street lights with high-tech LED lights, which provide more illumination than

the existing conventional street lights.

Council's action authorizes the city to enter into various contracts for the purchase of related equipment and supplies.

Council had previously approved the sale of bonds to pay for the project, estimated at \$25 million. The goal is to replace the city's 61,000 street lights in 2019. Ward 1 will be one of the first communities to have lights installed. The LED lights are expected to reduce maintenance costs by 80 percent and energy costs by 10

Council also approved a companion piece of legislation that authorizes the city to purchase and install security cameras on city light poles located in high-crime and heavily travelled areas.



Most households will receive invitations my mail, with options to respond on line, by phone or by mail.

The U.S. Constitution mandates that everyone in the country be counted every 10 years. The first census was in

The results of the census are used to reapportion the House of Representatives, determining how many seats each state gets.

Also, the distribution of more than \$675 billion in federal funds, grants and support to states, counties and communities are based on census data.

Completing the census is mandatory. By law, all respondents to U.S. Census Bureau household and business surveys are kept completely confidential. Your responses are safe, secure and protected by federal law.

The information you provide can only be used to produce statistics.
