Our Cleveland Public Library Eastman Branch at 11602 Lorain Ave. will be closing on December 4, 2021 and re-opening in late 2022. The Rockport Branch at 4421 West 140th Street is open during the closing of Eastman.

Also, the library provides a service called **"Words on Wheels,"**, which brings the library to your door, providing library services to patrons at your residence. This is a free resource for us while Eastman temporarily closes for construction. If you have a library card, you can call a neighborhood branch or the main library at 216-623-2800 to request materials.


The materials will be delivered to your house. When done, return items to any Cleveland Public Library location book drop or any CLEVNET member library.

On the private side of development, **Cleveland Auto Nation** recently spent about \$1 million in our ward to open a new store at 3540 West 117th Street.

Also, **University Tees**, a manufacturer of t-shirts, is expanding its operation with a move to Cleveland from Lakewood. The move will bring 249 jobs into our ward with a

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University Tees Coming Soon to Ward 11



University Tees is moving into Ward 11 from Lakewood. It is a full service t-shirt manufacturer that will bring 249 jobs into the ward with a payroll of about \$10 million. Councilman Brian Mooney supported the move by working with the city to provide the company a vacant property loan of \$180,000 and a development grant to help them with their expansion at 2201-2235 W. 110th.

This will help them bring full occupancy to a partially vacant building they purchased this year. University Tees was founded in 2003 out of a dorm room at Miami University, in Oxford, OH. University Tees has also set up a philanthropic program which donated nearly \$300,000 in 2020. Organizations they donate to include St. Jude's Childrens Hospital, Make a Wish and the American Cancer Society. Let's welcome them to Cleveland.





Believe Mortgages Available for Residents to Become Homeowners

Believe Mortgages from CHN Housing Capital, the lending arm of CHN Housing Partners, are available for local residents and many may find it's less expensive to own than to rent.

The Cleveland-based nonprofit wants to make homeownership broadly accessible and sustainable.

CHN Housing Capital can originate mortgages of \$20,000 to \$250,000, but the program's preferred loan is for \$70,000 or less so-called small-dollar debt that can be tough to

Since early April, when the program debuted, CHN Housing Capital has received more than 500 inquiries from potential homebuyers. Thirteen clients have closed on purchases or are near closing. And 35 applicants have pregualified for a loan but still are looking for houses.

The 30-year, fixed-rate mortgages are available in Cuyahoga and Lorain counties. Buyers must have a credit score of at least 570 and put down at least 3% of the purchase price, though low-income borrowers can tap downpayment assistance programs to come up with those funds.

CHN Housing Capital does not require borrowers to pay for private mortgage insurance, which can add to the cost of a conventional home loan for buyers without much cash on hand.

Borrowers must complete a first-time homebuyer class before closing. They also have access to other CHN programs and services, including home-repair loans of up to \$8,000.

CHN has numerous programs – home repair loans and other offerings – that can help people become home owners.

Storefront Renovation Program Creates Fresh Faces

Ward 11 is seeing the exterior renovations of two commercial buildings, funded in part by a city program aiming to promote neighborhood commercial retail districts.

One of the buildings -10025 Lorain Avenue – was completed in June and already has a new tenant after sitting vacant for

10 years. The other building – 9609 Lorain Avenue – is about to undergo an exterior renovation through the program.

Cleveland's Storefront Renovation Program offers financial assistance, combined with free design assistance from the city to restore exteriors of commercial structures.

168 Persons attended the event on July 28 which featured over 25 animals & 2 ponies for pony rides.








