A Message from Councilman Brian Mooney

Dear Residents,

We all know that the last year has been a challenging time for everyone, residents and businesses in our neighborhood. And while the pandemic has waned, it's not over. Please, if you or your children 12 and older haven't, get vaccinated.

Even during the pandemic, things have been moving forward both to completion and in planning. **Here are three examples of completed development projects that recently opened in our Ward:**

- Amazon distribution center opened
- Dunkin Donuts opened
- Jabco Gas and Convenience Store opened

Amazon is finally open and operating at the 21 acre former site of Midland Steel at 10801 Madison Ave. The company is hiring both full-time warehouse workers starting at \$15 per hour and benefits, as well as Amazon Flex Drivers, who are considered independent contractors and are able to make their own hours and earn an average of \$22 per hour. To apply for Amazon jobs you must go online at www.amazon.job.

In terms of benefits, the company offers healthcare, disability insurance, 401(k) with 50-percent match, among other competitive perks.

Amazon will also currently pay up to 95-percent of tuition costs for courses regardless of whether the courses benefit the company.



Jabco gas station/convenience store at 3585 W. 117th is open after about a \$1.8 million dollar construction project. In addition to the new gas pumps and convenience store, Jabco also sells hot sandwiches at their deli counter.

Dunkin Donuts is open at W. 117th and Trisket

at the site of the former White Castle Building. Finally we have a place to buy donuts and coffee in our ward.

There are more good projects in the planning stages for Lorain Ave and in other areas of our neighborhood. Stay tuned.

Construction will soon be underway, and some units have already sold, of the **new townhomes on the southwest corner of Clifton and West boulevards**, designed to look like a mansion.

And city parks, pools, and recreation centers are open, as our libraries – check out the summer activities at Eastman Library. Summer is the time to explore the neighborhood, meet neighbors, and take a walk or hike or bike to the lake for a dip.

Jefferson Rocks, in our neighboring ward, is being brought back this August by Councilman Brian Kazy. Be sure to check that out too in Jefferson Park. **The Edgewater Sidewalk Fest** is planned for Sunday, August 8th.

While I'm a relatively new council member, I've met so many of you, even during the pandemic. **I look forward to meeting more of you as we restart meetings and other events.**

New Driveway Thanks to Pavement Maintenance Specialties

In January, a Wayland Avenue resident came home from work to see half his driveway ripped up. The contractor was supposed to replace a driveway a few houses down the block on Wayland Avenue, but accidentally started the job at the wrong house.

By June the driveway wasn't fixed and the contractor's number was disconnected.

Initially I answered complaints from constituents about the eyesore, thinking the homeowner was negligent. After I spoke to several neighbors and the homeowner I learned the resident was a victim.

As a former prosecutor, I knew this situation was civil in nature and not criminal, a determination Cleveland Police confirmed.

I then called Channel 19 News, in the hopes a story would shame the contractor to make it right. Channel 19 agreed to run the story, and Pavement Maintenance Specialties, a local asphalt/concrete company with 100 years experience at the edge of our Ward at 8219 Almira Avenue saw the story and agreed to help the resident.

Pavement Maintenance Specialties poured a new free driveway two days after the story. The resident is happy. Thank you Pavement Maintenance Specialties and Channel 19 for assisting me in helping make this right for our resident!

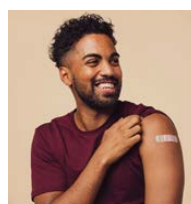

Cleveland 50/50 Sidewalk Residential Replacement Program (Call 664-2232 to Request an Estimate)



PROGRAM DESCRIPTION

Repair unsafe sidewalks through a partnership between the City of Cleveland and its residents where each party pays 50% of the cost. The 50/50 Sidewalk Program is voluntary, but deciding not to have the required repairs made under this program does not relieve the property owner of his/her responsibilities or liabilities under Codified Ordinance 505.11 of the City of Cleveland.

PROGRAM PROCESS

Upon request, a city inspector will visit your property and assess your sidewalks. The city inspector will prepare a cost estimate, and sketch. Those documents along with an authorization form, program rules & regulations and a return envelope will be placed on the property in a "City of Cleveland" door hanger bag.

QUALIFYING CRITERIA:

- Property must be zoned residential
- Adjacent sidewalk slabs have a height difference 1/2 inch or more
- Sidewalk slabs that have a large amount of surface spalling/chipping greater than 1/2 inch deep
- Sidewalks with a large number of cracks that results in rocking or movement
- Sidewalks that pond water causing ice to form

ELIGIBLE REPAIRS :

Sidewalks, Drive walks, Driveway aprons, Carriage paths, Curbs at the ends of driveways. Areas made of stone slab or bricks will be replaced with concrete.

INELIGIBLE REPAIRS:

- Sidewalk paths leading to the home
- Curbs in front of the tree lawn

The occurrence of work will depend on when the resident's matching funds are received by the City. In the event City funds are totally utilized and you have authorized the work at your residence, you will be notified by the City.

FINANCING INFORMATION

The City's matching funds are limited. Should they become depleted the program will be suspended until additional City funds are allocated. However, requests for sidewalk estimates will continue to be received and performed.

NOTE: Authorization forms and payments received after August 31, 2021 may be performed in Spring 2022.

Set Out Guidelines for Waste Collection



For your convenience the 2021 City of Cleveland Division of Waste Bulk Pick-up Calendar is on page four of this newsletter. In addition to bulk pick-up dates, the calendar includes information about proper waste set out. **Here are some tips to make sure your waste collection is compliant with city set out guidelines:**

Rule of Three

Remember that the **limit for bulk pick-up is three items**. Residents may leave out for collection items such as appliances, tables, chairs, mattress box springs, couches and furniture. **All mattresses, box springs and cloth furniture must be wrapped in plastic.**



In addition to the three items, residents may leave out **up to four tires**. The City does not accept construction material. Boxes and loose bags are not bulk items. Carpet must be cut and rolled into 3-foot long pieces and must not exceed 40 pounds.

Waste Set Out Rules

The Division of Waste also reminds residents of the following waste regulations:

- Only waste in officially issued City carts will be accepted, and loose trash or bags outside City roll carts will not be accepted.
- Construction materials, hazardous waste, bricks, dirt, concrete, cinder blocks, auto parts, loose metal items, medical waste or fluorescent tubes **WILL NOT BE ACCEPTED** in or outside of roll carts.
- No wet paint should be placed in roll carts. All paint cans should be dry before they are placed in roll carts.
- Do not place hot charcoal ashes in roll carts. For further information regarding waste collection, please call the Division of Waste Collection at 216-664-3711 or visit www.clevelandohio.gov
