A Message from Councilwoman Jasmin Santana

Dear Ward 14 residents,

I know this summer has been a trying time with the Covid-19 pandemic continuing to hit individuals and families throughout our neighborhoods and the entire country.

In March, when we hoped the pandemic would be under control by now, myself and my staff were working on ways to support families during this deadly virus. And so far, we're seeing a lot of people coming together and helping each other during this global emergency.

Meanwhile, national events this summer brought peaceful protesters to the Second District Police Station, with nearly 1,000 people lifting their voices against racism and injustice. Local restaurants and bakeries stepped up to donate food to the protesters, including Las Dos Fronteras, Half Moon Bakery and Brunos Ristaurante. A local family helped by providing dozens of hot dogs and hamburgers.

I'm pleased that a handful of families participated in our "Painting a Better Picture" yard art competition in July. Residents were tasked with using supplies and artifacts from around their houses to create art.

The winner of the contest received a Home Depot gift card and some free landscaping. Our office was surprised by the number of children who participated. Archwood Ave, grabbed a map and a free family pack of chalk and set off to create their pieces of art.

"City Life," a local teenager hangout, partnered with our office this summer to host two movie nights. Cars of families drove up, ate free snacks, and watched family movies from the safety and comfort of their cars. To help, 88.1 radio dedicated transmitting Ice Age directly into the cars.

Our "Painting A Better Picture" family day and chalk extravaganza was paired with the Esperanza Inc. School Supply Giveaway (photos inside). Hundreds of families swung by Lincoln West High School and received a book bag full of school supplies. And the next day, the Cleveland Hope Exchange gave away 1,000 pairs of shoes to families.

Community partners made each event happen and I appreciate their hard work

and dedication to making this community a better place. This year the Jones Home Neighborhood Association traded their annual street sale, for a Porch Party (photos below). Journey Church and the Cleveland Hope Exchange offers a drivethru food pick-ups the last Saturday of each month.

Facing Eviction? There's help with Right to Counsel

Right to Counsel – Cleveland (RTC-C) gives eligible Cleveland tenants free legal representation in eviction hearings in Cleveland Housing Court.

To qualify, a tenant's income FREE EVIC must be at or below the federal poverty guideline, and the tenant must have at least one child in their household.

What does Right to Counsel – Cleveland mean for tenants?



RTC-C provides legal help to
Cleveland tenants facing eviction
so those tenants may stay in their
homes or locate better housing,
stay out of emergency shelters,
and keep their children in school.
A lawyer can help a tenant
improve housing conditions, and
avoid eviction and homelessness.

RTC-C families also may receive information about resources for rental assistance, case management, access to food,





and other important services.

Councilwoman Jasmin Santana will be part of the second cohort of "Fresh Innovators" showcased by Spark - a social impact campaign under the Cleveland Leadership Center - to build Fit & Healthy Leaders.

Cleveland Leadership Center collaborated with FreshWater Cleveland and WKYC Channel 3 Studios to recognize five change makers who are digging into Cleveland's challenges, creating solutions, and turning ideas into action:

Jasmin Santana and Alysha Ellis are being recognized as Co-Founders of S.E.E.D.S (support, empower engage, develop, sustain), a women's empowerment program offered by Freshly Rooted - a community effort rooted in healthy food access.





CLE Rally - BHITC Project Information

- 1. Mobile Grill-A-Nator 3340 Trowbridge Ave. Youth from CLC came up with an idea for a mobile grill-anator for neighbors and organizations to utilize for a small rental fee. They worked alongside Lakewood CLC to complete the project.
- **Orchard Connection Project** Kat, alongside Cuyahoga Valley Church, cleaned up and added some new landscaping elements to their community orchard.
- **POPCE Community Garden 5407** Storer Ave. Will and POPCE partnered together with Journey Church/The Hope Exchange to clean-up the POPCE garden and prepare it for the following year of community events and gardening.
- **Berry Lot Restoration 7403** Berry Avenue. Tracy and Berry Ave. neighbors, alongside Parkside Westside, came together to build a pocket park with picnic tables, walkway, flower beds and grills in



- 5. Bush Ave. Block Party Bush Ave between 41st and 44th. Larry and his block club, alongside Journey Church and The Hope Exchange, hosted a block party to improve relationships with neighbors and advocate for a safer street. They had a food, games for kids, and passed out "drive like your kids live here signs" to neighbors.
- **6. #1 Garden** 3121 W 48th St. Art, alongside Cuyahoga Valley Church,
- cleared and cleaned the existing garden, filled raised beds, and added a walkway for community use in the future.
- 7. 70th & Camden Greenspace Bonnie and neighbors, alongside Ohio City Church, completed some new

improvements to the community park they established about 5 years ago. They put up a fence and added some new garden beds for future community events.


