## A Message from Councilwoman Jasmin Santana

Dear Ward 14 residents,

I am greatly honored and appreciative that you have re-elected me for another four years as your Ward 14 representative in City Hall.

On January 3, 2022, during a ceremony in City Council's grand chambers, I raised my right hand and solemnly swore "that I will faithfully, honestly and impartially discharge the duties of the office of Cleveland City Council."

It seems like only yesterday when I first pledged my oath of office, which was four years ago, becoming the first Latina elected to City Council.

And today, I am just as much committed and excited about the work we have begun and continue to do throughout our community. And I am grateful for the opportunity to continue that work.

**During the last four years, we've seen significant investment and development in the ward, ranging from 50 affordable, single-family homes to multi-million-dollar renovations of our historic factory buildings, which are being repurposed for office space, studios and apartments.**

A new spirit is moving through Ward 14, as we are seeing more and more volunteers participating in neighborhood beautification projects. Residents are tired of illegal dumpers, run down structures and general blight.

So a number of them, including my staff and the staffs of various neighborhood non-profit


groups, are taking ownership of our community, determined to restore neighborhood pride.

- New police officers will have a probation period of six months.

## Winter Snow Plan for City Streets

Plowing is provided to primary  
and main secondary streets  
throughout the city. Service is  
directed first at main streets until  
they are passable, then service is  
redirected to residential streets as  
soon as possible.

As soon as snow plow drivers  
report road conditions, supervisors direct trucks accordingly. The goal is  
to plow all streets within 24 to 72 hours after a major snow event  
depending on the actual amount of snow fall and weather conditions.

Residents should find OFF STREET PARKING in advance of snow  
plows coming down the street; for cars and vehicles which have not  
moved, pose a serious hazard to traffic and make it difficult to clear  
the roadway. For abandoned or snowed-in cars on your street call 216-623-  
5400 and provide as much information as possible to the Fourth District Police.  
For more information or to report hazardous road and snow conditions please  
call Snowbird at 216-664-2510.

Don't forget to clear your sidewalk of snow for pedestrians! Urban myths  
that property owners are liable if a pedestrian slips and falls on a shoveled  
sidewalk are false. On the contrary, the City Code requires property owners to  
clear their walkways. Clearing sidewalks prevents pedestrians from walking in  
the street.

## Crossing Guard Positions Available

Crossing Guards are recruited by the City year-round and currently, there are  
multiple positions available to serve for one of our Ward 14 schools. Guards  
will earn \$20.50 each day and are required to work two 45-minute shifts  
during the school year- one in the morning and another in the afternoon.
