Cleveland Commission on Black Women and Girls

Legislation was passed on June 6, 2022 by Cleveland City Council to create the commission, to be made up of 14 appointees with different backgrounds and experiences. The commission will be able to recommend programs, policies and legislation aimed at improving the quality of life of Black women and girls in Cleveland. Councilwomen Stephanie Howse and Deborah Gray, who sponsored the legislation, want to keep those interested informed on the process. The next step is appointing members.

Recycle Cleveland Program Restarting Guidelines:

- · Your address must be enrolled in the City of Cleveland's recycling program to participate.
- If you've already enrolled, don't worry. If you haven't, please go to clerecycles.com or call 216-664-3030 to enroll by July 31st.
- Households are mailed a list of recyclable items, and other educational information after enrollment.
- Recycle only the materials on the City's list. View list at: www.sustainablecleveland.org/recycling
- · All materials for recycling must be inside the blue recycling cart (none outside of cart)
- Carts may be placed curbside for collection weekly, between noon the day before collection and 8:00 am on collection day.
- For residents who chose not to opt-in, the blue carts will be picked up in the fall.

We envision creating connections between diverse neighborhoods, safer streets for all ages, races, and modes of travel, and welcoming places where people can embrace their full humanities. Our streets have been designed to hold a much higher traffic flow than they receive, and decorated crosswalks and curb

extensions can help slow traffic and create safer spaces for people crossing the street.
