On February 4th, Ward 10 Councilman Anthony T. Hairston and Ward 7 Councilwoman Stephanie Howse co-hosted two great events at East Professional Center – a **Utility Resource Assistance Fair and the Midwest CannaWomen Career Fair & Expungement Clinic.**

**The Utility Resource Assistance Fair – the largest fair to date – serviced 302 families.** Residents were able to get crucial aid, including support with utilities, homeownership, and rental assistance at the utility fair. And at the expungement clinic, those in need received help with getting a case sealed or removed from public record. Those in attendance were also linked with employment opportunities.

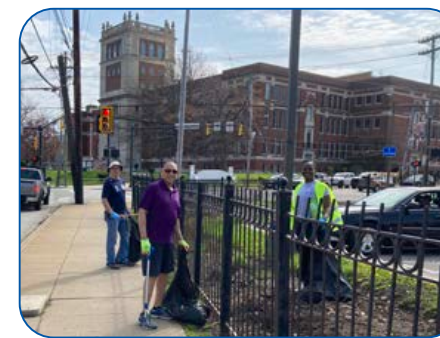

### City of Cleveland Exterior Paint Program

#### Application Requirements

- Must be a low or moderate-income family.
- must reside in the house being painted.
- must attend Lead Safe Work Practice Class.
- If owner lives at property, he/she must be the applicant.
- Paint vouchers are available to homeowners and tenants.

You may qualify for up to \$600.00 in free paint and supplies labor not included- applicant must paint their home or hire contractor.

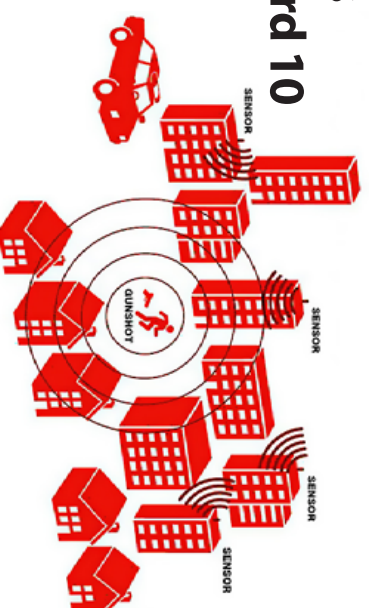
## ShotSpotter is Coming to Ward 10

ShotSpotter gunshot detection system will be expanded from 3-square-miles to 13-square-miles in Cleveland after council approved the legislation

Currently ShotSpotter is only in a 3-square-mile pilot section in the 4th Police District that was paid for by a grant to the city. **The pilot area now touches Wards 1, 2, 4 and 6.**

Funding of the expansion is close to \$2.8 million from the city's American Rescue Plan Act dollars.

"If there is a tool we can add, if there is something else that we can do in addition to getting more police officers on patrol, then I'm all for it," said Ward 10

**According to police numbers, nine lives have been saved following a ShotSpotter alert, along with 44 arrests and 52 guns seized, directly tied to use of the technology.** And average police response time in the area with the technology is more than two minutes shorter than in the rest of the 4th District.
