Councilman Brian Kazy recognized Mr. Art Reichel as Ward 16's Outstanding Senior of the Year at the 33rd Annual Cleveland Senior Day, held on May 25, 2023.

Art is a life-long Clevelander with a long family history who has lived in the same house his entire life. In fact, his house was built by his great great grandfather, who was a detective with the Cleveland Police Department and worked alongside Elliott Ness. His treasured family home has welcomed and sheltered eight generations and counting!

An only child, Art attended the Cleveland Public schools in his neighborhood including McKinley Elementary, Carl Schuler Junior High and John Marshall High School. He met his wife, Cathy, at John Marshall in 1973, and they were married a year after they graduated. They are looking forward to celebrating their 49th wedding anniversary next month on June 29th. Art and Cathy are the proud parents of three grown children, Janet Fedarko, Daniel Reichel and Judy Reichel. They are also loving grandparents and great-grandparents to children who keep him very busy with baseball and basketball games.

Always wanting his family close, Mr. Reichel and his wife lived together with his mother until her death at 92 years old, and they also bought the duplex next door back in the 1990's so his mother-in-law could be nearby as well. Currently his sister-in-law and brother-in-law live in one unit, and his daughter lives in the other. His other two children only live blocks away, and he wouldn't have life any other way than surrounded by family.

Art retired in 2012 from the City of Cleveland Division of Water where he worked at the Garrett Morgan Water treatment plant as a water treatment plant operator. His son, Daniel, worked for pipe repair in the city and in 2012 he was hired as a treatment plant operator too. As a nod to the legacy, Art's plant manager requested that Daniel be assigned to Garrett Morgan so that Art could work his last week on the job side by side with his

- 2. We will mail your ballot to you with a return envelope.
- 3. Vote and return your signed ballot envelope before Election Day.

Dates, Deadlines and New Rules for Voting

October 11th: The Board of Elections will begin mailing ballots to voters who have submitted Vote-by-Mail ballot applications.

November 7th General Election Information



New Rule: the deadline to submit Vote-by-Mail ballot applications has changed. Vote-by-Mail ballot applications must be received by the Board of Elections on or before October 31st.

Vote-by-Mail ballots **must be postmarked on or before November 6th.** Hand delivered ballots may be dropped off at the Board of Elections until 7:30 p.m. on Election Day.

Voting Location Changes: Your voting location may have been changed for the November 7,

2023 General Election. Voters are encouraged to confirm their voting location when making their voting plans. Confirm your voting location at www.443vote.us or by calling 216-443-VOTE (8683).

New Rules for Early In-Person Voting: Photo identification is required when Early In-Person Voting. The identification requirements for Early In-Person Voting are now the same as when voting on Election Day.

Voting On Election Day

Voting hours: Your polling location will be open on Election Day from 6:30 a.m. to 7:30 p.m.

What ID should I bring?

Acceptable forms of unexpired photo ID include:

- An Ohio Driver License
- An Ohio State ID Card
- An Ohio Interim ID form issued by the Bureau of Motor Vehicles
- A U.S. passport or passport card
- A U.S. Military ID card, Ohio National Guard ID card, or U.S. Department of Veterans Affairs ID card (that includes the voter's name and photograph)
