A MESSAGE FROM Councilman Kevin L. Bishop

Dear Residents,

I hope everyone is having an enjoyable summer and getting out to walk the neighborhood, stopping at parks and enjoying the weather.

I want to inform you of an issue that will affect all residents: rising water rates. These hikes are the first in several years.

Cleveland Water customers can expect higher bills next year, by about 3.5%. The average monthly bill for Cleveland residents is estimated to be \$25.58, up from the current average of \$24.71. (Please remember sewer rates are not from the city and the city has no control over those rates which are set by from the Northeast Ohio Regional Sewer District.)

After the 3.5% increase, there will continue to be 3.75% hikes each year starting in 2026 through 2029.

Outside of Cleveland, 69 other communities pay the Cleveland Water Department (CWD) for their supply. There are four different service areas. The farther from the lake, the higher the water rate because of the increased cost to move water up and out.

The increases are to support capital improvements, fund operating expenses, and to provide long-term rate stability (eliminating one-time rate spikes). In the last 20 years CWD has invested nearly \$1.5 billion in the system.

Damage to water mains – the primary pipes carrying Cleveland's drinking water – has been happening more frequently. Because of this issue, the Water Department has shifted from a "fix" to a "replace" approach, which is more costly.

Ways to Save on Your Water Bill

Water Affordability Program

The Water Affordability Program offers a 40% discount on all standard water charges. This includes both the monthly fixed charge and the consumption charge. To qualify for the program, a customer must own and live at the applying service address and have a total household income at or below the current income guidelines, which are based on 200% of the annual Federal Poverty Level guidelines.


Homestead Program

The Homestead Discount Program offers a lower fixed charge and consumption rate. To qualify for the Homestead Discount Program, customers must meet the following criteria:

- Be 65 years or older, or totally and permanently disabled;
- Own and live at the service address; and
- Meet income guidelines.

To enroll in the Homestead Discount Program, customers must complete and submit an application. Enrollment is valid for 3 years, after which a renewal application is required. Reminders will be sent to customers when renewal is required. Homestead applications are available on the Cleveland Water's web site clevelandwater.com or you can call customer service at 216-664-3130 (Mon - Fri, 7:30 am - 5:30 pm).

Habitat for Humanity to Build 10 Homes in the Mount Pleasant Area


Greater Cleveland Habitat for Humanity is in predevelopment on 11 homes on East 143rd St. in Ward 2 in the Mount Pleasant community, between Kinsman and Bartlett. All of the homes will be sold through Habitat's 0% interest affordable homeownership program, with Habitat aiming to break ground in late 2024 or early 2025.



Habitat's program prepares future homebuyers by requiring at least 200 hours of sweat equity to be completed before a buyer can purchase a home. While Habitat cannot guarantee matching applicants to houses in their own neighborhood, applications to become a Habitat homeowner are open. If you or someone you know is interested in the Habitat program, they can check out Habitat's website to pre-apply: https://www.clevelandhabitat.org/ or they can call Habitat at 216-429-1299.

These homes are being built as a result of Councilman Bishop sponsoring American Rescue Plan Act (ARPA) Funding Legislation to support affordable homeownership in Ward 2 and throughout Cleveland.

Cuyahoga County Announces Proposed Results of Sexennial Property Reappraisal

The Cuyahoga County Fiscal Office announced the proposed results of the state-ordered Sexennial Reappraisal and how it will affect property taxes. The proposed results, pending approval by the State of Ohio, show an average increase of 32% in home values across Cuyahoga County.

Property owners will receive the proposed valuations in the mail in the coming weeks. Property owners who would like the Appraisal Department to reconsider the proposed valuation can file for informal review by the end of August.

The County will host a series of four community informational sessions to discuss the reappraisal process, updated valuations, and property taxes. Informal reviews will be completed in November. Tax bills will be available in December. Tax complaints can be filed with the Board of Revision from January through March of 2025. View the map of the 2024 Sexennial Reappraisal Impact below:



Residential property owners who want to contest their valuation must submit an Informal Review Complaint July 1 – August 30, 2024 or a Formal Tax Complaint January 1 – March 31, 2025. For more information including the complaint submission process visit: https://tinyurl.com/countytaxes


