Now that the weather is getting warmer and the days are getting longer, more people are heading outside. You'll see more walkers, runners, and people riding their bikes. That's why it's important for everyone to slow down and stay alert, especially when driving through neighborhoods, near parks, and around schools.

Even though it feels great to finally enjoy the sunshine, it also means there's a greater chance of accidents if we're not careful. Whether you're driving, biking, or walking, following a few simple safety tips can help keep everyone safe.

Safety Tips for Drivers

- Slow down in residential areas and near crosswalks.
- Look out for pedestrians and bicyclists, especially at intersections.
- Put your phone away – distracted driving is dangerous.
- Give space – leave at least 3 feet when passing someone on a bike.
- Be extra careful at night and in poor weather.

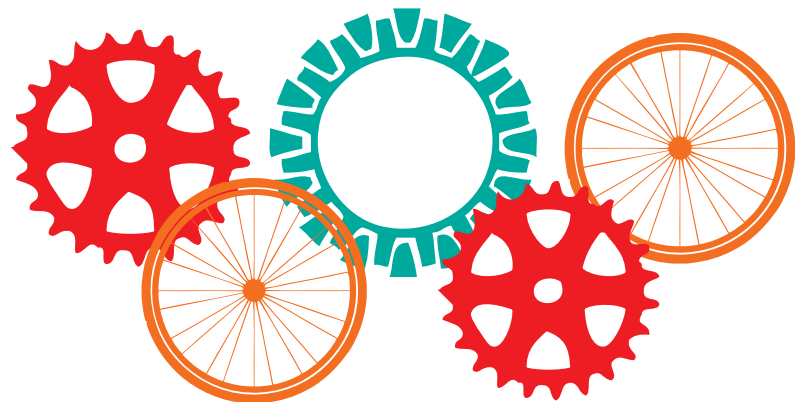
Safety Tips for Pedestrians

- Use crosswalks and obey traffic signals.
- Stay alert – don't text or wear headphones when crossing the street.
- Make eye contact with drivers before crossing in front of them.
- Wear bright or reflective clothing so drivers can see you.
- Walk on sidewalks whenever possible

Safety Tips for Bicyclists

- Always wear a helmet.
- Ride in the same direction as traffic, not against it.
- Use bike lanes when available.
- Follow all traffic signs and signals.
- Make yourself visible with lights and bright clothing, especially at night.

DO NOT FEED THE DEER



Feeding deer endangers both their health and your safety.

Supplemental feeding of deer may actually decrease its chance of survival. Encouraging deer to congregate in unusually high numbers at a feeding area makes them more vulnerable to predators and at risk for the spread of disease.

PLEASE BE ADVISED:

In the city of Cleveland, **it is illegal to keep your trash cans in the front yard.** They must be at least behind the front door line and in the rear of the house when possible. Also, **it is illegal to park automobiles in the grass, especially in your front yard!** These are 2 simple things we can do keep Old Brooklyn beautiful.

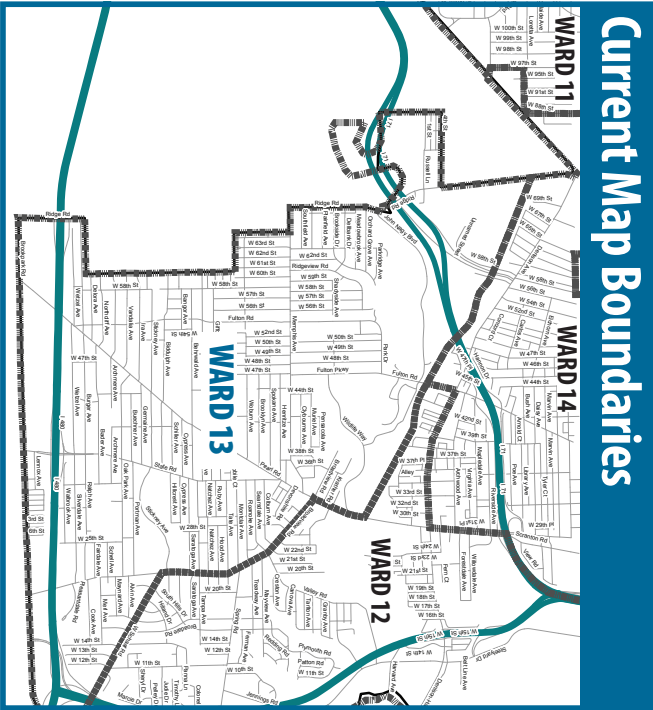
A Message from Councilman Kris Harsh

In 2008, Cleveland voters approved a charter amendment that ties the size of City Council to the city's population. **With the completion of the 2020 U.S. Census, we were required to reduce the number of Council seats from 17 to 15. Every ward in the city was altered.**

Below is a map showing the **new ward boundaries** that will affect this year's elections and will become the legal boundaries in January of next year. When you vote this year, you will be voting for a Councilperson to represent these new wards.

The Cuyahoga County Board of Elections should have already contacted you regarding these changes, including any updates to your polling location. To find your polling location call the Cuyahoga Board of Elections at 216-443-8683, scan the QR code below, or visit boe.cuyahogacounty.gov/voters.
