Dear Ward 10 Family,

We're living through challenging times that have tested many people's physical and mental health. The impact is visible not only in our communities but also in our shared emotions. I encourage you to reach out to family, friends, and neighbors to check in and support their well-being.

School has resumed, please be cautious of children and school buses while driving. A child is four times more likely to die when hit by a car going 35 mph than one going 25 mph. **As you approach school zones, reduce your speed to 20 mph, even if you do not see flashing lights and or signals.** Please slow down and keep our children safe!

Beginning next year, we will have a new ward map. Since Cleveland's population has declined, City Council had to reduce the number of wards from 17 to 15 and draw new ward boundaries. Some of you will be assigned a new ward number. Others will remain in this ward, where they will be joined by people who have been redistricted into our ward. **These new ward boundaries will take effect January 2026, and residents will vote on who should represent the new wards on November 4, 2025.** To all those who will no longer be in my ward, it was my honor and pleasure to represent you, and I thank you for the opportunity. **Please visit boe.cuyahogacounty.us or call 216-443-8683 to check your voter registration status and to request a vote by mail application.** View the map at right for Ward 10's polling and precinct locations.

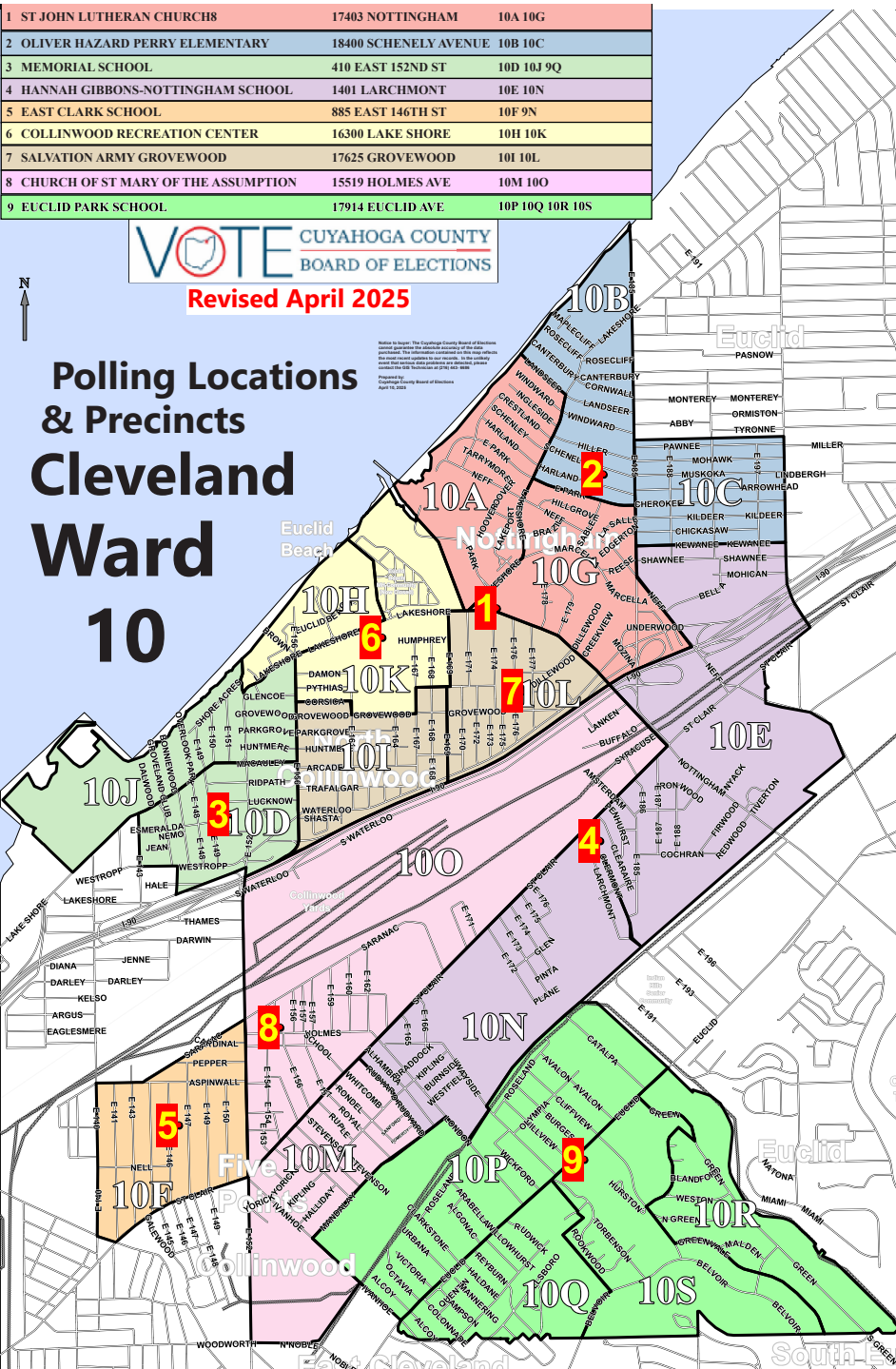

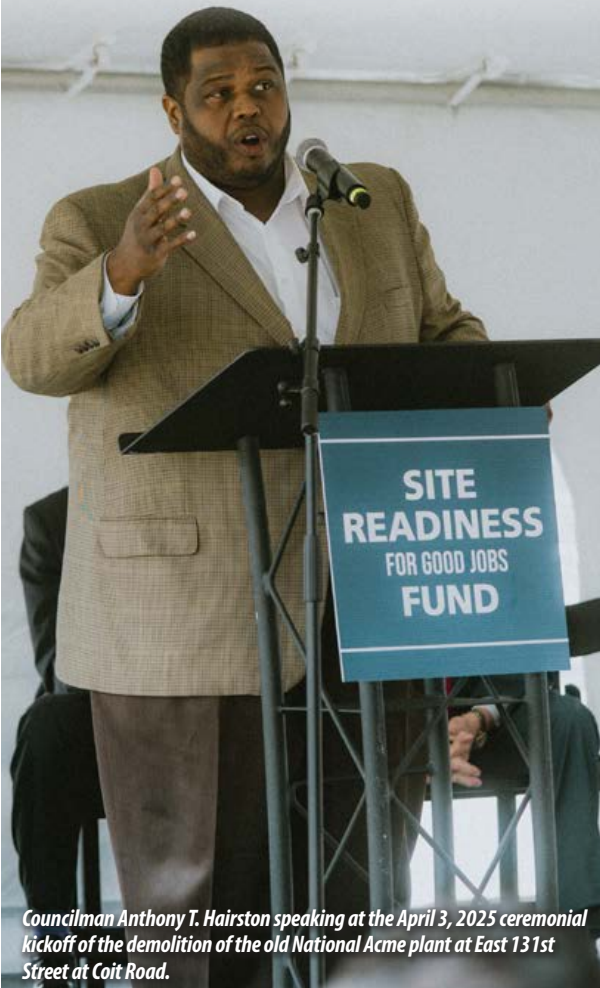

Below are a few of our accomplishments with much work to be done:

- ▶ **\$10 million in housing funds** – launching a program focused on building new affordable homes, rehabbing vacant homes, and home repairs for current residents aimed at stabilizing our community. (beginning fall 2025)
- ▶ **Revitalized several parks and playgrounds** such as RJ Taylor Park in Nottingham Villages; Glenview (Dupont) Park in Glenville; Groton Park in Euclid-Green with new play equipment, and new play surface - creating safe and attractive spaces for children, seniors, and families to enjoy.
- ▶ **Completion of major roads** such as E. 152nd, Ivanhoe Rd, E. 140th, Euclid Ave, Green Rd, London Rd, Shaw Ave, and E.105th.
- ▶ **Pushed for the demolition of the long-abandoned General Electric Site (GE) on East 152nd Street**, paving the way for a forthcoming large-scale clean manufacturer to locate in our community and provide good paying jobs.
- ▶ **Led the demolition of several abandoned homes** that stood for years as eyesores.
- ▶ **Created both an illegal dumping crew and grass cutting crew** to quickly respond to Ward 10 residents' concerns.
- ▶ **Celebrated the opening of the Goodwill Outlet and Opportunity Center**, which brought new jobs, job training opportunities, and affordable goods to residents.
- ▶ **Dedicated Medical Center** opened after the closing of Rite Aid at E. 152nd.
- ▶ Partnered with Famicos to distribute **over 500 turkeys, hams, and gift cards each year to support residents who may be experiencing need.**
- ▶ **Gave away over 300 book bags & school supplies each year** to support students and their families.
- ▶ **Continued funding the Five Pointe Community Center** that provides hot meals to seniors, monthly produce distribution, and offers different programs and services.

- ▶ **Installation of several impressive and visually impactful murals** throughout our neighborhoods.

Age-Friendly Home Investment Program 2026

The Cleveland Department of Aging's Age-Friendly Home Investment Program **helps Cleveland homeowners with one major home repair**. Eligible residents must be 60 or older, or 18–59 with a disability, own and live in their home for at least one year, and meet low- to moderate-income guidelines (for example, up to \$39,125 for one person or \$80,375 for a family of four). Applicants must be current on property taxes and not in foreclosure or bankruptcy.

Funds are limited, so apply as soon as possible! Download the application at www.clevelandohio.gov/aging under *Resource Links* (eligibility criteria is listed on page one of the form). Completed Applications can be submitted to the Cleveland Department of Aging by:

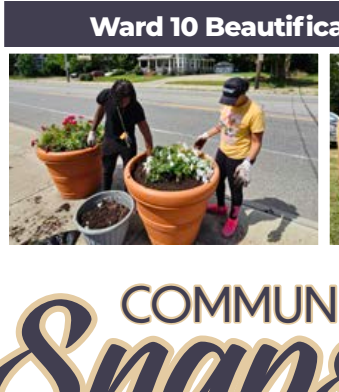

Smoke Detectors Save Lives

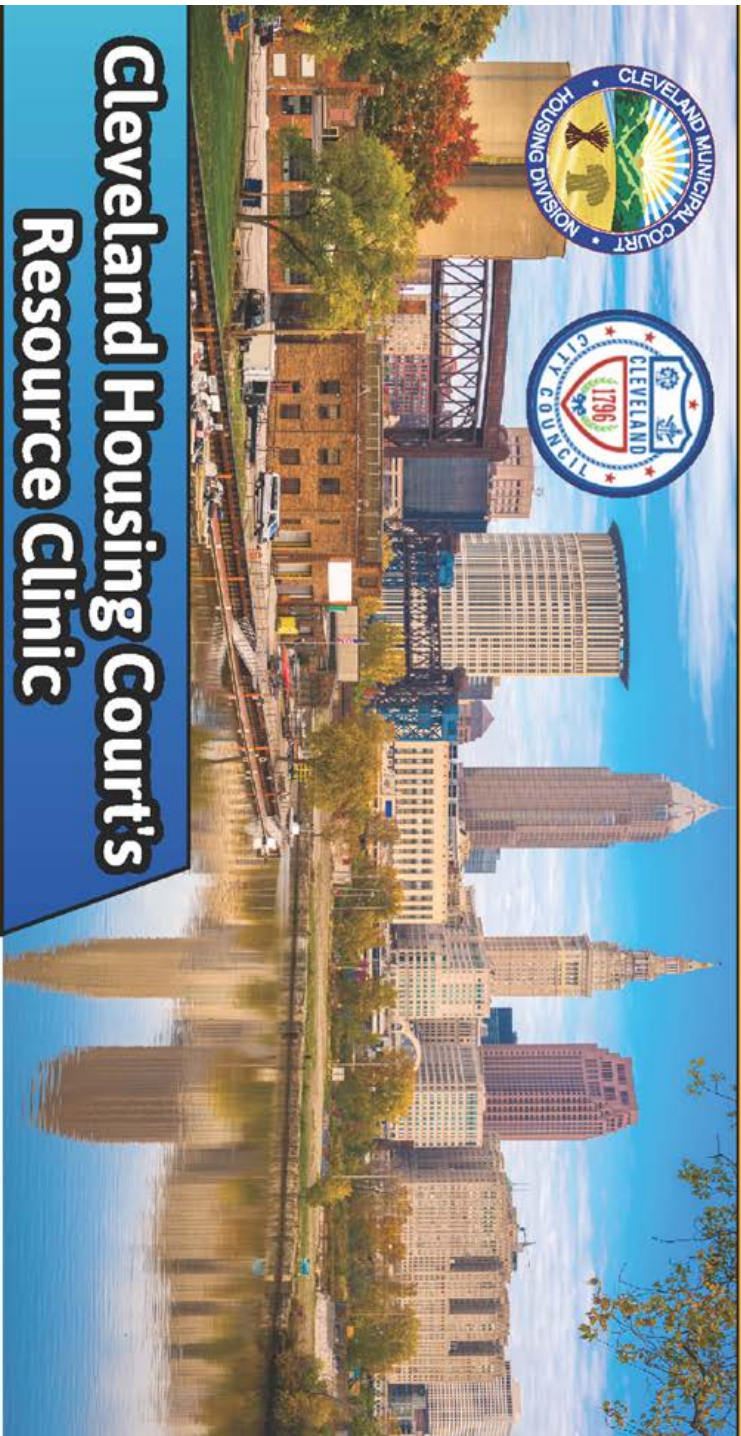
