Joining the councilman were several service providers and agencies, Mayor Justin Bibb, and Council President Blaine Griffin. Both leaders gave glowing remarks about Councilman Kelly. Both touted the councilman's accomplishments in being the go-to voice for workers, safety, hands-on service, affordable living, and housing in Cleveland.

Mayor Bibb shared some "sage" advice the councilman gave him. "He told me, run hard, run with compassion, and if you are blessed enough to win, stand by your work," said Bibb. This was followed by Council President Griffin stating "Danny is a Cleveland success story. On council, Danny has been a force. When Danny speaks, Council listens".

Ever humble, Councilman Kelly attributed his success to his "new union, my fellow members of City Council and this administration who I partner with to

- Affordability for families and seniors through lower utility costs and affordable housing

- Revitalizing our ward with new construction and big upgrades to parks, streets, sewers and infrastructure

He also stressed people need to be and feel safe in their homes because "safety hovers over everything we do" and that residents deserve a councilman who will listen – and act." As a lifelong Clevelander, who raised four kids here on the west side as a single father with a union book in my back pocket, I know sometimes we need a helping hand. I am who I work for. Call me, I will be there!" said Kelly.

True to his nature, Kelly served up pizza and snacks for all to enjoy a convivial environment. The night was a big success. We look forward to next year!

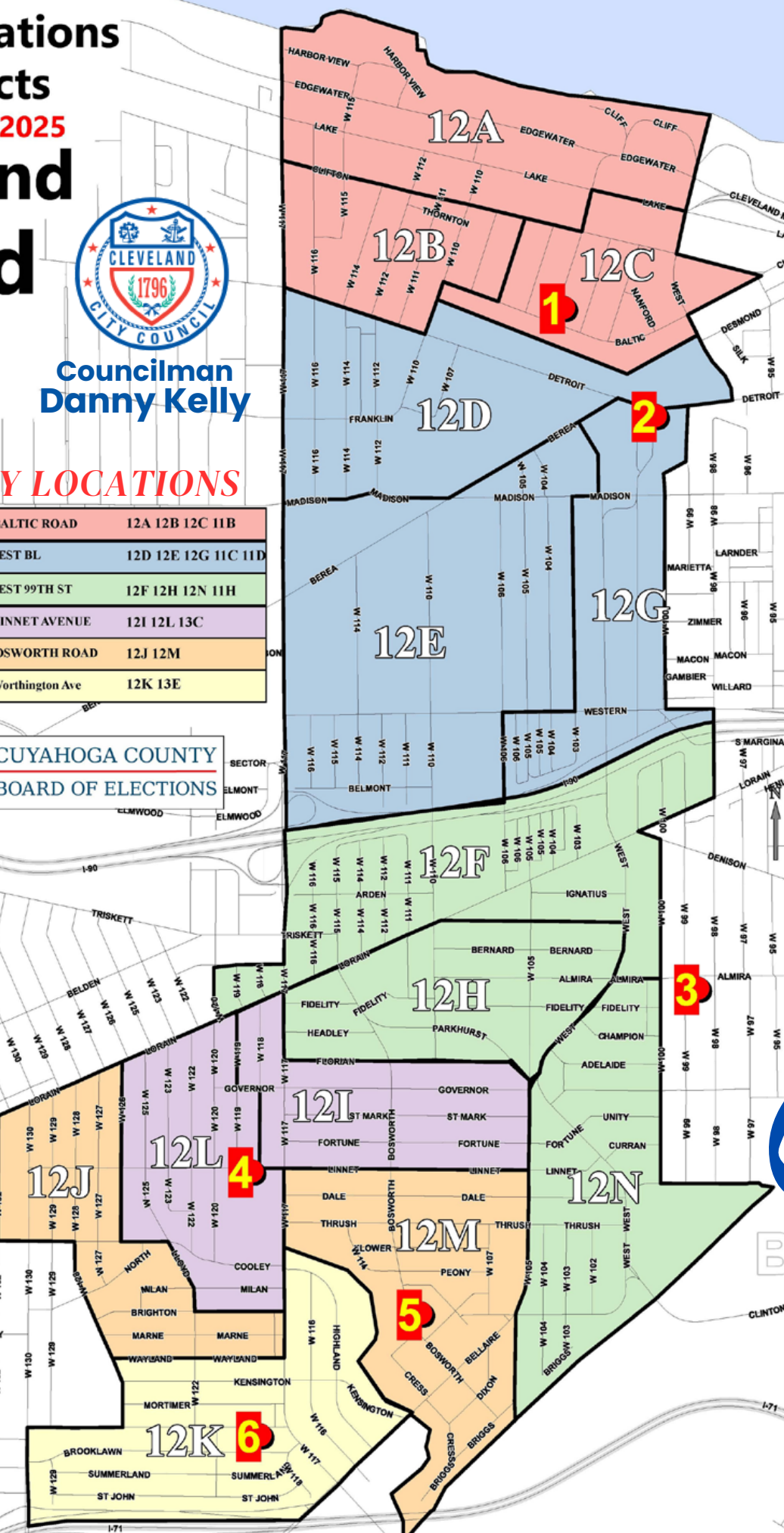
