


Ward 5 Councilman - City of Cleveland

Changes to Voting Locations Take Place Immediately





Councilman Richard A. Starr's TRACKRECORD Serving Ward 5:

- S Lead an initiative to declare Gun Violence a Public Health Crisis.
- Championed an effort to ensure Cleveland Metropolitan School District students received \$20 million of one-time spending from McKenzie Scott's gift to the district. The money will be used to broaden students' horizons, strengthen support for staff and principals, and make improvements that benefit the district and community. Students will decide how the money is spent.

- Secured \$550,000 from Major League Baseball to build a stateof-the-art Digital Arts Studio.
